
GOOD QUALITY ONLY

ROAD SAFETY REMINDER

We've received a number of messages and emails from concerned Villagers about road safety at our school, especially where children are utilising pedestrian crossings. It's a good time, as one term draws to a close and a new one is on the horizon, to remind ourselves of some important rules that are there to prevent accidents and keep our students (and everyone) safe.

10KM SPEED LIMIT

10km is SLOW (crawling speed) – after you exit the school roads, it is still only 40km. PLEASE SLOW DOWN.

and of course, you must not touch your phone while driving!

PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS

you must slow down on approach and stop if anyone is about to cross – the crossing that leads to our front gate (from Eton Road) is wide – please stop if you see children on the footpath about to enter

PARKING

please do not park illegally in disabled bays, ambulance bays or in the middle of the road to let your students out – it is not safe for anyone
