Ice Skating at Macquarie Centre

Embrace the cold! Stage 3 kids & families / carers are invited to show us your moves and twirls at the Sunday Mega Skate session at Macquarie Ice Rink.

Please rsvp by 'buying' a free ticket via the floktu link below, just so we can get an indication of numbers. You can purchase your actual tickets from the ticket booth at Maguarie Ice Rink as usual.

Public prices for the Mega Skate session are:

- Kids (5-15 years old) \$25 including skate hire
- Adults \$27 including skate hire
- No entry fee for non-skaters

Mega Skate ticket includes unlimited skating from 10:45am-4:15pm. While we're suggesting that LLV Stage 3 join just for the afternoon session, from 1pm - 4.15pm, you can get there much earlier if you want to.

Adults & siblings are very welcome to come & skate too, or grab a coffee and have a chat to other parents & carers in the bleachers to the left hand side of the rink (opposite side to the shoe hire).

The previously sold out Ski Trip now has a few places available! The Ski Trip has been organised by Stage 2, 3 and 4 Socialites, but anyone is welcome!

The trip will be at Ski Rider, a great place just 10 minutes from the lifts. The price includes a hot buffet breakfast with fruit, yoghurt, pastries and cereals and a delicious buffet dinner and dessert every night. It also includes a shuttle bus which runs throughout the day.

DATES

Starting on the 24th September. You can stay as long as you like. Ski Rider are offering 5 nights for the price of 4, so most people will probably stay for 5 nights. This is the start of the September school holidays.

COST

Nightly Cost: \$328.80 for a twin plus \$53.60 for each child This ends up at \$436/night for a family of 4, or \$348/night if you stay for 5 nights (this is a very good price and includes a 20% discount for our group).

INCLUSIONS

Cooked breakfasts and dinners each night and shuttles to and from the ski slopes throughout the day. The lodge is 10 minutes from the lifts.

Ken & Thuy have been working hard with Munch Monitor to get the ordering logistics smooth and efficient. When an order is missing, the most common reason is because the customer has not completed the check out process properly, so please make certain you have received an email confirmation in your inbox when placing your orders. Ken & Thuy will always make up an order for a student and get in contact for payment if neccessary. Please note that all primary (K-6) lunch orders are taken to their learning spaces - only high school (7-12) students should be collecting orders from the cafe.

If you'd like your student to be able to use the Snack Money option on Munch Monitor, please make sure you have added a current, clear photo of them on their profile and selected the amount of money you'd like them to be able to spend. Students can them pick up an ID tag from the cafe which will be connected to their Munch Monitor account. Cafe staff can quickly scan their tags to find their account and use the Snack Money to pay - or they can pay with cash or card, of course!






Tiptoe Giants just released a new album!



Vidya Madabushi is an Indian writer living in Sydney. She has an MA in Creative Writing from the University of Sydney, and her first novel, *Bystanders*, was published in India in 2015. *Bystanders* was shortlisted for the Tibor Jones South Asia Prize, and a previous version was longlisted for the Australian Vogel Award. In 2018, Vidya received the Writing NSW Grant for Fiction for the creation of this novel. *The Days Toppled Over* is her Australian debut.

Set between Bangalore and Sydney, *The Days Toppled Over* is a powerful exploration of mental health, family and the lives of international students in Australia. With a rich sense of place, a memorable cast of characters, and a good dose of humour, it illuminates how we all need friends and contact with other humans — and how these simple things can result in transformation.
